



DO I HAVE TO CERTIFY MY DOCUMENTS?

Unless documents are in English they need to be translated by certified German translations. Documents need to be submitted as **originals** or certified copies, **certified by:**

- University
- Foreign Ministry of the country issued
- Austrian Embassy/ Austrian Consulate

All documents which were issued in one of the following states do not require a certification:

Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Liechtenstein, Macedonia, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Romania, Serbia and Montenegro, Slovakia, Slovenia, Sweden, and Switzerland

Documents which have been issued in one of the following states only require a certification in the form of an official authentication by an appropriate authority in the country of issue:

Albania, Andorra, Antigua with Barbuda, Argentina, Armenia, Australia, the Bahamas, Barbados, Belarus, Belize, Botswana, Brunei Darussalam, China (Hongkong and Macau), Colombia, Cyprus, Dominica, El Salvador, Estonia, Fiji, Greece, Grenada, Guyana, Ireland, Israel, Japan, Kazakhstan, Latvia, Lesotho, Liberia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malawi, Malta, Marshall Islands, Mauritius, Mexico, Monaco, Namibia, Nive, New Zealand, Panama, Portugal, Russia, Samoa, San Marino, Seychelles, Solomon Islands, Spain, St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Lucia, St. Vincent and Grenadia, South Africa, Surinam, Swaziland, Tonga, Trinidad and Tobago, Turkey, Ukraine, United Kingdom, United States of America, Venezuela and Zimbabwe
