Duties and Responsibilities

The University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences, Vienna (Universität für Bodenkultur Wien – BOKU) seeks a post-graduate research assistant on "Innovation system analysis of forestry and the wood construction sector in Europe", being part of several international research projects in the frame work the European Forest Institute Regional Office for Central-Eastern European Countries (EFICEEC). The project assistant will conduct analyses of policies and of relevant innovation systems, write scientific articles, contribute to the dissemination work in the two projects and will contribute to the administration of the EFICEEC research network.

The forest sector currently gains attention because of its potential to contribute to the mitigation of climate change, among others, through providing renewable energy sources, or renewable building materials. These sectors offer great innovation potential.
