It is directed towards refugees who seek for support regarding the commencement of a possible study program and wish to enhance their language skills. You may possibly start or continue your study program as a regular student at a later point in time.

Refugees need MORE than safe accommodation and food – they also need intellectual nourishment.

BOKU strives to give asylum seekers a chance to continue their study they have already undertaken in their home country or to satisfy their desire for academic further education here at BOKU. Thus, BOKU opens its doors and offers refugees the opportunity to study at BOKU under the MORE initiative.

We are delighted that you are interested in the MORE project at BOKU and wish to continue your study program or support those with a refugee background.

Who May Participate?

Men and women with the following status:

- Asylum seekers with an asylum application card according to § 51 AsylG
- Persons entitled to asylum
- Persons entitled to subsidiary protection according to § 52 AsylG
- Tolerated persons according to § 46a FPG

BOKU – University of Life Sciences

BOKU was founded as THE agricultural university in 1872 offering Agriculture, Forestry and Environmental Studies. In honor of the 75th anniversary in 1948 the „Austrian Academy of Agriculture and Forestry“ was founded. It included four sections, Agriculture, Forestry, Land Management and Zymotechnology. In 1991 Landscape Economics and Landscaping and in 2004 Food Science and Biotechnology were introduced as new study programs at BOKU.

BOKU was listed among the top 100 universities (ranks 51-100) in the "QS World University Rankings by Subject 2012" in the field Agriculture and Forestry. In the Green University Ranking 2012 (ranking sustainable universities) BOKU was listed on rank 8 within Europe and rank 21 worldwide.

Today BOKU is a modern and international university of life sciences with 8 Bachelor's, 30 Master's and 4 PhD programs serving more than 13,000 students.

BOKU's Fields of Study

The University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences offers a broad spectrum of Bachelor's programs taught in German as well as Master's and PhD programs taught in German and English in the following fields:

- Agricultural Sciences
- Forest Sciences
- Wood and Fiber Technology
- Environmental Engineering
- Food Science and Biotechnology
- Landscape Architecture and Landscape Planning
- Environment and Bio-Resources Management

Admission is granted as irregular student. You may possibly start or continue your study program as a regular student at a later point in time.
