Application Procedure

If you are interested in applying to Michigan Tech through an exchange agreement, first contact your home institution for instructions. After you complete their procedures and are nominated to apply to Michigan Tech, visit the international admissions webpage for a list of application steps (see the Exchange Students section) and a link to the online application:

*If you are a graduate student interested in exchange studies, contact your home institution's exchange coordinator to confirm whether graduate students are permitted through the exchange agreement.

Course Selection

Upon acceptance into Michigan Tech, you will receive an email that will include instructions for course registration. Course registration is required to complete prior to arrival. Students can select courses from any department. A minimum of 75% of coursework must be at the undergraduate level, regardless of your level of study at your home institution. Please note that course selections are not guaranteed, and you may be required to show proof of pre-requisite knowledge to enroll in your selected courses.

Language of Instruction/Required Language Proficiency

English is the language of instruction at Michigan Tech, so you are required to have a high level of English proficiency to participate in our exchange program. Please note that preparatory language courses are not available for exchange students.

Tuition, Fees, and Health Insurance

Applicable fees depend upon the exchange agreement; for most direct exchanges, students pay tuition to their home institution and pay student fees and on-campus accommodation to Michigan Tech. Additionally, students are responsible for travel costs, textbooks, and personal expenses.

All graduate and international students are required to have health insurance while enrolled at Michigan Tech. However, you are not required to purchase the Michigan Tech health insurance policy if you can provide proof of comparable coverage from your home country.

There are three residence halls available for you: Douglas Houghton Hall, McNair Hall, and Wadsworth Hall. Each of these includes a dining hall, laundry area, exercise room, and other convenient facilities. Two apartment communities are also available for students ages 21 and older: Daniell Heights and Hillside Place.
