

URBACT – Zusammenfassung 3. Call 1. Stufe MC Entscheidung am 23. April 2012 in Kopenhagen

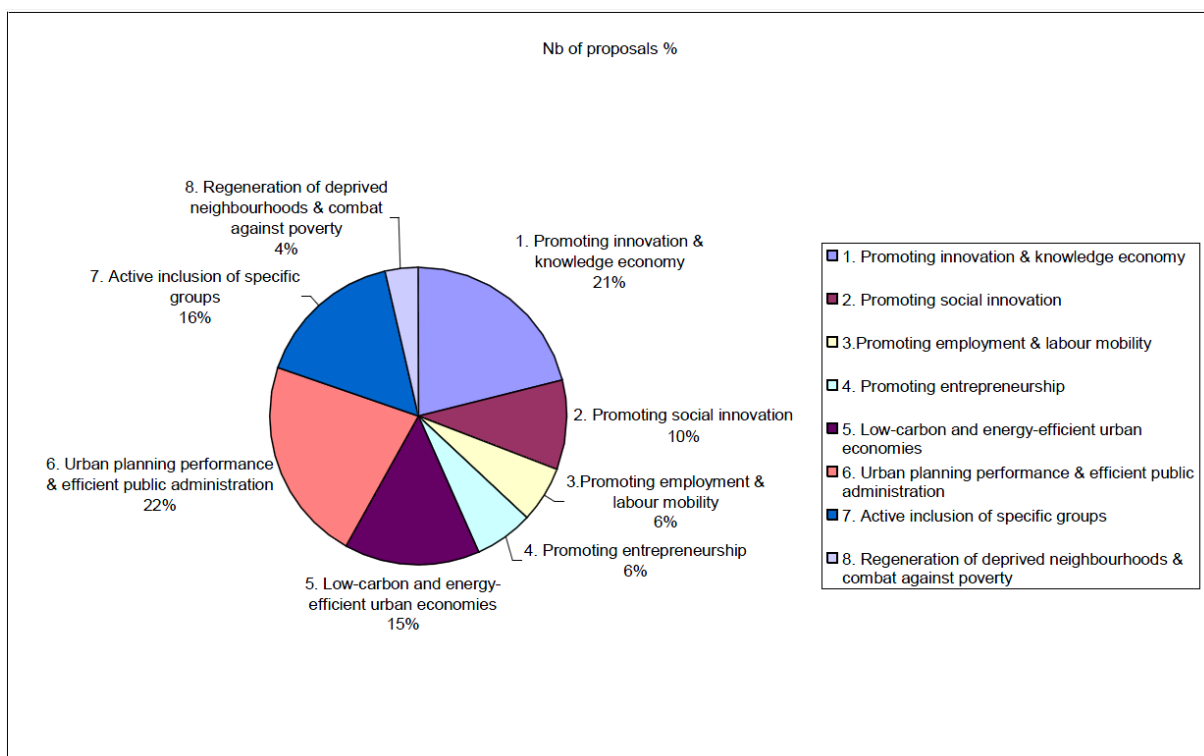

1. Überblick über eingereichte Projekte

Der 3. Call war vom 9. Dezember 2011 bis 15. März 2012 für Projekteinreichungen offen. Dieser Call orientierte sich thematisch an den drei Säulen der Europa 2020 Strategie (Innovative Städte, Nachhaltige Städte, Inklusiv Städte). Dazu wurden acht mögliche Themenfelder vorgegeben. Neben der Fokussierung auf einen der Themenschwerpunkte sollten von allen Projektanträgen der Umgang mit folgenden drei Aspekten adressiert werden:

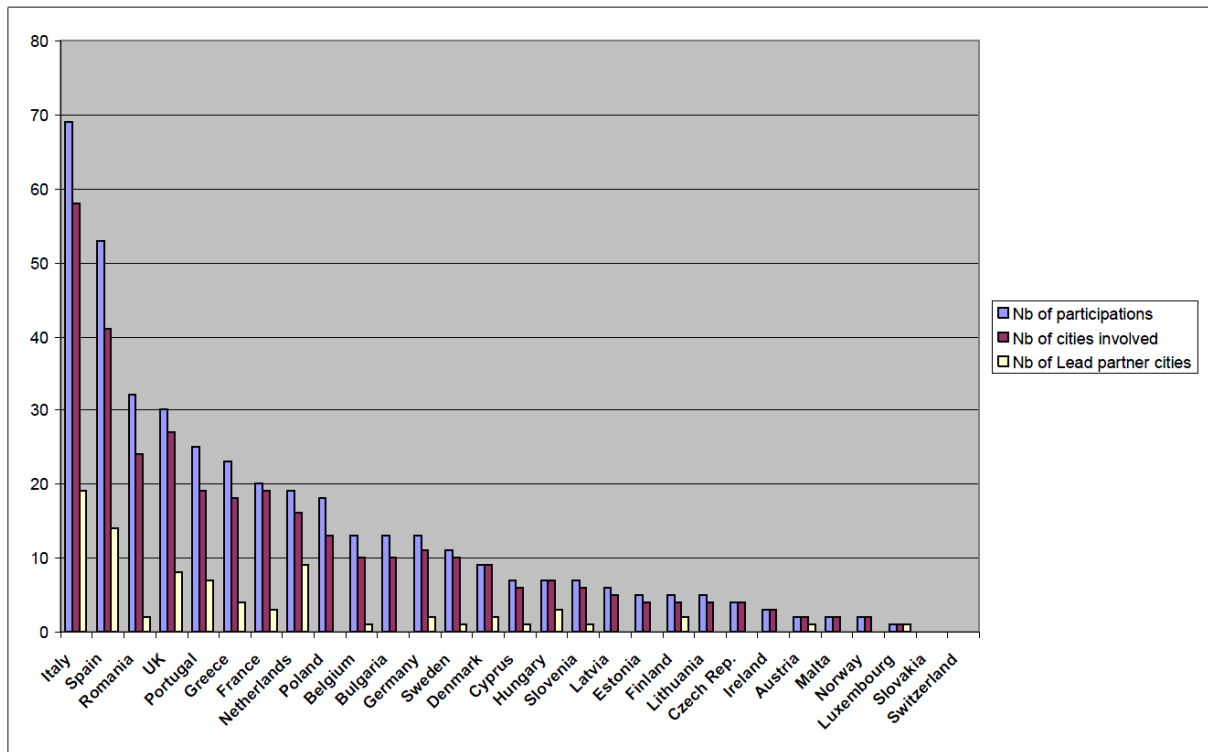
- Steuerung der Stadtentwicklung im Kontext der Wirtschafts- und Finanzkrise
- Unterstützung eines integrierten und nachhaltigen Ansatzes in der Stadtentwicklung
- Entwicklung effizienter Partnerschaften und Multi-Level Governance Prozesse

Insgesamt wurden 81 Projektanträge eingereicht. Folgende Übersicht zeigt die Aufteilung auf die 8 Themenschwerpunkte. Mehr als 43 % der Anträge wurden in der Säule Innovative Städte eingereicht (in der Abbildung Punkt 1-4). Die wenigsten Anträge in der Säule Inklusiv Städte (in der Abbildung Punkt 7 und 8).

Die meisten Partner stellten die Länder Spanien und Italien. Eine Übersicht zu den Projektpartnern aus den einzelnen Mitgliedstaaten gibt die untenstehende Abbildung. Ein Projekt wurde mit österreichischem Lead Partner eingereicht (ACTS – St. Pölten), in einem weiteren Projekt war ein österreichischer Partner vertreten (Urbenergy – Tulln). 7 Projekte entsprachen nicht den Formalkriterien, darunter auch das Projekt ACTS mit Lead Partner St. Pölten. Die übrigen 74 Projekte wurden durch das „External Assessment Panel“ bewertet. Die bestgereichten 19 Projekte wurden schlussendlich durch den Begleitausschuss genehmigt. Darunter kein österreichischer Partner. Die Auflistung der genehmigten Projekte erfolgt in Punkt 2.

2. Genehmigte Projekte für die Entwicklungsphase

Die Dauer der Entwicklungsphase beträgt 6 Monate. Am Ende der Entwicklungsphase ist ein vollständiger Antrag (Final Application) abzugeben, um in weiterer Folge nach Genehmigung des MC in die Implementierungsphase einzusteigen.
