Study Programmes available

1) Undergraduate Students accepted for a 10 month Exchange programme:

The courses available for students on 10 month undergraduate exchange programmes will be carefully selected to meet the students' academic needs. These will be chosen from those available to our undergraduate students studying for the BA(Econ) degree who have selected Economics and/or Business Studies as their single or joint area of specialisation. 2) Postgraduate students accepted for a 22 month programme leading to the MSc degree:

In their first year these students will enrol on courses available to students in the Diploma in Economics (September to June). In their second year they will enrol in courses available to students in the MSc in Economics (Environmental Economics) pathway (September to June) and complete a dissertation under the supervision of staff in Environmental and Resource Economics (June to September).
