

Georg-August-University Göttingen vacancy: 15 Open Positions - Doctoral Researchers in Food Systems Economics

The Research Training Group (RTG) “Sustainable Food Systems” has been established in September 2021. The RTG combines excellent interdisciplinary research and graduate training related to the sustainability of global and local food systems.

Food and agriculture are playing key roles for many of the global challenges such as poverty, undernutrition, overweight and obesity, climate change, and biodiversity loss. It is obvious that the United Nations’ Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) cannot be achieved without major changes in food production and consumption. But what types of changes are useful at what level and how these changes can be implemented politically, economically, and socially are open questions that will be addressed by the new RTG, focusing on both rich and poor countries.

The RTG is generally organized in cohorts of doctoral researchers (i.e. PhD students), of 36 months per cohort funded by the DFG. The first cohort has started 1 September 2021. The starting date of the second cohort will be 1 September 2024. Besides the PhD students, two Postdocs are also members of the RTG.

In addition to funded positions, we welcome PhD students (and Postdocs) with own funding or scholarships (e.g. from DAAD) who are interested and qualified to work on topics related to Sustainable Food Systems. The starting date for these scholarship positions is flexible, i.e. could be any time. For details on the different categories please see below.

We have position openings for 15 Doctoral Researchers in Food Systems Economics. The positions should be filled by 1 September 2024.
